Thank you to those who have given extra for various needs that we've presented in these newsletters. We still need a **full size mattress** for one of our regulars. Also a **side-table** would be helpful. And for our office a more **up to date computer** would be helpful for our donation intake program and e-mail use.

We are confident that by the time this goes to print we will have had a marvelous time at the concert/fundraiser on **October 24 at My Church. The Senti's will have shared music and updates on Envision.** More details to come next month.

Open mic has picked up again in attendance, but we still plan on **having the last open mic on December 17 of this year.** You're welcome to join us for that as well, since Mitchell and Rochelle will share Christmas songs and everyone will share memories of open mic.

We've had many **testimonies of families reconciling with each other** in the last month and we're particularly thankful for that. One of our greatest joys has been seeing folks growing in the LORD so obviously. A single mom picks up four folks, getting up with her son early in the morning, just to get them all to house church. Folks are growing in sharing, listening, speaking truth in love, and healthy relationships.
