Our dear friend **Keith Botkin** from the Lincoln Square apartments' house church was **baptized on February 12 at the Jesus Gathering!** We had a marvelous celebration together and have enjoyed meeting at Hope in Christ at 4:30pm for that once a month service. While there another man expressed the desire to be baptized, so we invited him to the following Sunday service to start classes. He came to the service, but we heard he rededicated his life to Christ at Mt. View Church and we rejoiced that he is planning to be baptized there!



On one of our street nights we prayed with a homeless fellow who was unable to stay at the Lighthouse Mission because of disruptive conduct. He was at his wits end. One of our crew members was going to pray at the Light of the World Prayer Center from midnight to 4am so he invited him along. **The man received Christ at 4am** and stayed with a friend from the Prayer Center. He also received prayer for healing and the next morning had absolutely no pain, much to his pleasant surprise!

The next street night we had a couple of great opportunities for the Gospel as well, even encouraging a young musician on the street who desperately needed fellowship to join us. We have fellowshiped with him before and he was so thankful for our time together. With Gospel opportunities and reconciliations, prayer with those we meet, we so enjoy street night as we join Rising Hope Ministries on Tuesday nights to minister to the homeless. We usually hang out at 1st Baptist first and then go out from there. Evergreen Christian's 5th and 6th grade class donated socks as well as a 5th grade class from Lynden Christian, in addition to the socks we received the month before from a 4th grade LC class. We're so thankful and so are our friends on the streets for these donations!

That week on street night we also prayed with a man without housing who gladly received our prayers. The week before when we prayed for him he started making guttural sounds and shaking strangely. When we asked to pray with him he claimed that God wanted him to have "this dirty thing inside" him. We told him that he could be free from that and he said he would consider letting us pray for him about it. Last week we invited him to our Sunday night meeting, so **pray that he comes and receives prayer for deliverance;** he did seem open to doing that this past week.

The only feedback we've received on the experiment so far is that people want to see each other more often in the larger group setting. **Please pray for us to have wisdom** on that request; maybe we could have informal get-togethers more often or something like that.

Sunday: The Jesus Gathering meets at Hope in Christ (Sunset and James) from 4:30pm-6:30pm on the 2nd Sunday of the month. Jesus Study at 5pm on all other Sundays at the Majestic (1027 North Forest).
