We had four guys with us at the last one and **they were involved very much in the study, singing with us and engaging in discipleship.** One of them may even go to treatment through our referral. Morgan West leads that Jesus Study.

Timothy Potter leads the other at the Majestic and that is consistently a place of discipleship as well for many. We also hope to hang out more at the Boarding Home, **so pray folks from there can connect with us and others** more so they may grow in Christ.

Our friend Glenda Price is still building relationships at the hotel on Samish Way. She gets the opportunity to cut hair for the homeless. **Pray that her Bible study may take off the ground again and for partners in the Gospel** to be able to join her there.

She also goes out along with other volunteers with Street Connect which is led by Jon Ng in partnership with the Lighthouse Mission. They hit the streets five days a week and recently have seen **not only healing grace there, but also opportunities for people to connect with resources to move them forward** off the streets. The picture below is where our crew ministered during a protest against homelessness at the Courthouse in Bellingham. We didn't take sides, just prayed with folks. **Our crew goes out to all the camps to do ministry.**

Many of us became dear friends with him and he blessed us all very deeply.
