Praise God with us for His works!

Wow, the LORD has worked mightily among us and we are so thankful. We're learning just to be ourselves and let Jesus shine through us. As we shared with folks on Street Connect night we've seen the Lord do great things: sometimes it's awkward to sing at the Drop in Center at the Lighthouse Mission. It's almost like people don't want to look like their enjoying it for fear of what others will think. There are so many distractions. But as we keep on singing a spoon player joins us and others sing along. Afterwards a man thanks us for our singing and shares that he feels like such a failure. **We share the Gospel with him, which he believes with tears.** Morgan West continues to lead a Jesus Study there.

On another occasion one of our Stephen Servants goes out with a sense that the LORD wants to heal someone's left shoulder. He meets a man at Maritime Heritage who has just that need and prays. The man is so healed he moves his big backpack from his right shoulder to his left shoulder. **This fellow is looking for a church so pray that he can plug into one.**

Our partnership with the Lighthouse Mission has been wonderful and on one Tuesday night we also partnered with SERVE, a Christian Reformed youth conference put on by 1st Christian Reformed Church in Lynden with students from all over the country. As 60 of them listened to testimonies from the LHM and one of our workers who came to Christ at My Church in Bellingham, they are totally amazed at the LORD, who can bring folks out of drugs and into a transformed life in Christ! **The kids also went out with our team and shared Christ, sandwiches and socks with those they met.**



Some folks have tried to give towards our Zuni trip through Envision, but if you want to help it would be best to send funds to the Senti family directly though it can't be written off at the end of the year. The main costs are on renovating the RV. Already as the RV was in the mechanic shop **we had an opportunity to share the Gospel with a**

young man who was raised Hasidic Jewish but had become an atheist. We let him stay in the RV while his car was being worked on at the same time and he just "happened" to download the New Testament on his kindle to read it for the first time, so he was very interested in hearing about it.

On our trip the RV broke down twice and Mitchell got heat exhaustion in Boise, so it took a while to get to Zuni. The Senti's rented a van to keep going and left the RV with a mechanic in

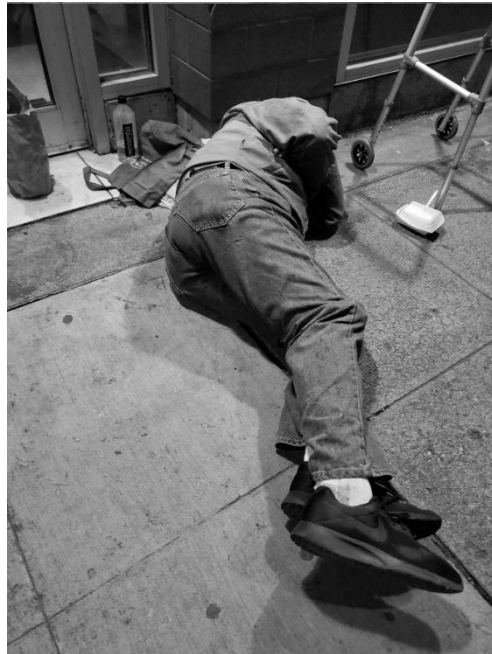
Our vision: to seek the face of Jesus!
