## **Praises and Prayers**

The Lord is definitely on the move through Envision; as I write this I'm very thankful. For years we've been praying that various porn shops would shut down and they have. It started back in the late 90's when my Dad and a friend of his prayed that one would shut down and it did within two weeks. We prayed over another and the same thing happened, and then another. So after that I would have youth groups pray over one that was located right next to the Lighthouse Mission and within a year, it also shut down. But we've been praying for one in the downtown area for many years and it seemed nothing was happening. Finally we noticed it had changed into an antique shop and we went in and starting to get to know the people there, let them know we were praying for them and even sharing the Gospel with them. They recently told us that they are phasing out all the porn books from the back room of the store and we rejoiced! Let's keep praying that this stronghold will be broken in our community and that people will see one another in purity and in real love through the power of the Christ Jesus Himself.

Our street team has enjoyed doing a Jesus Study at the Drop in Center and they often go on from there and continue to share the Gospel on the streets. In one case, at Maritime Heritage they shared with a man who appeared at least partially drunk. At first they wondered if sharing would do any good, but as they shared Christ he seemed to sober up and interact more and more with them, finally asking, "Where are you guys from? Can I join with you?"

That reminded me of a man who is now my neighbor across the alley because we used to share with him on the street when he was partially drunk. I rejoice because now **he has housing and is going to church regularly.** I asked him his story just the other day and didn't know that he had successfully owned a theatre with his wife, but when she died he began drinking and thus became homeless. I realized once again the thin line between my friends without housing and us who are housed. Still the Gospel is the thing that transforms!

At the Jesus Study that meets at McDonald's we shared with a homeless couple and they joined in with us, we helped them with food and now realize that they are camped in the woods behind one of our house churches and as we get to know them we hope to invite them to join us. Another man that was there, who also recently went through grief, **has now found housing** with the Jesus Study facilitator who rents rooms to folks that are ready. What a blessing this man has been already both to the facilitator and now to us.

We continue to do **baptism classes with various folks**, just finishing with one fellow who we used to pray with all the time on the streets and now he is set to be baptized at 1<sup>st</sup> Baptist at the end of June. Another fellow is finishing soon, just as a friend of ours just started. They should be baptized in August.

We really enjoyed doing another outreach at WWU, this time with not as much desire for New Testaments, but many excellent conversations about Jesus Christ and life in Him. **Pray that these opportunities may continue to abound for the Gospel to spread through Envision** and that many will be saved and baptized in Jesus' Name!
