We have another man moving in at the beginning of November. And we are super excited about the men who are living there currently, how their lives are transforming through accountability, encouragement and classes! Jesus uses it all to help us make disciples of Him. There are so many struggles and joys that go with this work of discipleship. Sometimes we think guys aren't going to make it- we may have to kick them out- but then we see God turn it around and make them even stronger! The Holy Spirit is working in the lives of these men. We can't share all the details, but know that transformation is happening and thank you for your generosity and prayers to that end.

Our Tuesday Street night has still been a great way of reaching out and inviting people into community in Christ Jesus. **Keep praying that the LORD will open doors for the Gospel** there and draw people to Him and to His Body!

One such story we can share is about our friend Sopaajay. That is his Canadian First Nation's name and it means "rays of the morning". His adopted name is Andrew Campbell. I met him in 2007 at three trees coffeehouse and he could hardly speak to me. Finally he did and we eventually became friends. (His picture is on page 2)

Christ, but he has come through shining like gold in Christ. The LORD showed him how he has been refined into a beautiful heavenly vessel through his trials. He wants to learn to be a blessing to all those around him. We have so many hopes and dreams we share with Sopaajay and he with us, but we trust the LORD for his future. **Pray for him that he might graduate in December** and go make disciples as he has been made a disciple himself. He even led his longtime friend Shane to Christ, as we shared in a previous newsletter. To God be the glory!

Also, a friend from a local boarding house is now coming regularly to meetings and is in Baptism class. Thank you for your prayers on his behalf. Our other friend who came back to town has not only been involved with our Drop in Center Jesus Study but also came back to the Jesus Gathering. And still another friend is still in Baptism class and regularly attending meetings with us as well as Hillcrest Church. Whether through deliverance ministry or just a helping hand, the Gospel is advancing and for this we praise God!

Our house church Kingdom multiplication meeting happened on October 19 at Hope in Christ Saturday and it went very well. There was honest sharing about how things are going and what we all want to learn. Another meeting is scheduled for November 20, Wednesday at 6:30pm with more and more folks interested. **Pray that the Kingdom will be multiplied through these efforts for the glory of Christ Jesus!**
