### This was the Vision for 2019 and an evaluation as well:

- 1- **Family discipleship** Each of our families have made family more a priority, some moving back to where they had come from because of separation, others of us making a family altar a greater priority. Mitchell has preached on this already and plans to continue to do so. Small groups have also been prioritized in providing family to those who are without. It seemed like this was an emphasis from the Holy Spirit this year.
- 2- **Launching Rising Hope** So instead of launching Rising Hope as its own non-profit our Board has decided to incorporate Jon Ng's vision into the core of Envision Mission! More details to follow!
- 3- **Neighborhood outreach-** On this we did not do as much, but we hope to do more with this next year.
- 4- **We also want to release a CD of worship-** and this happened as well with a concert in Bellingham and Lynden. We hope to do this again next year as well.

One of the things we've been learning at the Summit house is how to do self-evaluation well. And we also believe that's important for an organization to do. What was the vision for the year and how did we do in getting there? Also what is the vision for next year? We will share more on that in the next newsletter, but the "spoiler alert" is that it will have to do with neighborhood outreach, more Jesus Studies and expanding the vision of the Summit house!

We've started an outreach to Bellingham Technical College on the first Tuesday of the month. On one occasion, we had the opportunity to share the Gospel with a young man and that same day a new believer from Iran needed a church home and agreed to come to one of the Jesus Gathering house churches!

On another occasion God gave us the opportunity to pray with a man who used to be part of the Jesus Gathering, but has lost his way. Mitchell has also been able to follow up with the man who says he is a Deist and received a Bible some time ago. **Pray for all these and more to either come to Christ or come back to Him.**

We had the privilege of leading the memorial of Scott Colville who passed away on



November 24, 2019. He clearly professed his faith in Jesus, but died tragically in his apartment and God gave us the opportunity to share the Gospel with many (over 50 people) who loved him at the Lincoln Square apartments recently. Some have started coming to the house church and others inquiring about it because of this tragedy, so God even uses difficult things for His beautiful purposes. Isn't that like Him- He did that with the Cross and the Resurrection most especially and He still does it today. (Scott is pictured left.) We remember Scott fondly as a regular at the Lincoln Square house church and as our friend.

Please pray that God will give us wisdom about a new location for the Jesus study on Wednesdays. The man who was previously our man of peace in the Samish Way neighborhood has moved to the Bellingham Technical College area and will be joining us for outreach there. So we are seeking the LORD about what is next for our Wednesday night crew. Recently Jamie Sweet has helped lead that, so we are praying about many options of places to go next with the Word of Christ.

For us at the Summit House it's **amazing to see the transformation in the lives of the men there**. One of them has become our resident assistant for the next batch of men that will be coming in. Pray that the right men come for the next program year, starting in February, Lord willing. The clothes that were donated have finally been sold and the funds are coming in for the Summit house, especially to sponsor some of the men to start the next program year.
