Prayers and Praises!

Please be praying for our staff as we seem to be under attack in terms of health especially. But we are encouraged to see what God is doing among us nonetheless.

Envision had the opportunity to partner with the Light of the World Prayer Center and with Lighthouse Mission doing an outreach with a group from the Kansas City International House of Prayer. Students from that school joined us as we took to the streets. On one occasion **two of the students prayed for a man's shoulder to be healed and he himself testified that it was so.** Another group spent time praying with a man who was living in his van, but was also a believer needing encouragement. So often we find that our friends on the streets are believers, but need connection to the Body of Christ.

On **Street night we have had the opportunity to share the Gospel** in different ways. Our street night team was able to follow up with the man that the Prayer Center folks had met the night before. We are inviting him to join our Jesus study. Pray that he will not isolate himself, but will trust the Body of Christ again- the Church. Pray for him and for so many like him in that place. This past Street night we met so many folks; some who would sing with us on the corner of Railroad and Holly, others outside of 1st Baptist Church. These are believers, but they are disconnected and often therefore stuck in addiction. (Pictured below- one of our times of worship on Railroad and Holly St.)



That is why we value our partnership with the Lighthouse **Mission.** We have started these Summit houses so that as men and women learn to be restored through the Gospel mission they might enter into the life of the Church through Summit houses and into vocation, moving forward in their discipleship process.
