Looking Back, Looking Forward

Let's look at the vision for 2021 and evaluate how it went together:

Our vision for the year was: **Christ and Him crucified**. How did we behold and accomplish that vision? First, we proclaimed it through every ministry, including those listed below. Second, we learned about it at our staff retreat and with one another. Thirdly, we tried to hold it up for those we were in discipleship relationship with, though that could have been done more effectively. So we did well on the first two things, but not as well on the third.

More specifically we set goals for the year as follows:

- 1- We would like to **expand on the Summit House vision**, both for our current house and the 2nd one also. (On this point, a second house was raised up and both houses were filled, so that's pretty effective.)
- 2- We would like to expand our vision of **street outreach**, **neighborhood outreach** and **college outreach with BTC SALT** (The street night was taken over by some excellent leaders from Lynden, especially Cal Buys, Rob Smit and many others on a weekly basis. We tried to reach our neighbors, but could have been more effective in that particular ministry. BTC SALT was able to go on campus and start a small group of college students who needed faith connection there, as well as sharing with some who didn't know the Lord at all.)
- 3- We would like to do a new CD and a concert or two to encourage our supporters in meditating on God's Word and worshipping Him. (We produced two CD's this year and had concerts for our supporters as well, meditating on God's Word and worshipping Him together!)

All we know about the vision for 2022 is the theme is "the Church" and we want to focus on "strengthening the Body". More in the next newsletter on that...

On street night we saw a gal that some of the guys had prayed for and she went up to them and thanked them for their prayers. "Prayer works!" she proclaimed and explained how well she was now doing. One man asked if he had sinned too much the other night and Cal and the guys were able to express the Gospel to him.
