



The Belonging Class continues to be an effective means by which graduates from the Lighthouse Mission can be introduced to local churches. The guys go on field trips to meet local pastors at their churches and see what it's like. **Pray that these dear men will find community in the Body of Christ**. The class is led by Matt McCoy from Spring Church with the help of us from Envision Mission.

One of our friends from the Lynden Summit house, Jeremy, has shared his testimony a number of times in local churches and folks have been super blessed by that. He is working with a Bellingham construction company and involved at 2<sup>nd</sup> CRC in Lynden as well. He has even gone out with us more than once on street night and shared his story with those he used to know on the streets to give them hope. These outings on street night



aren't just ways to give out stuff to the homeless. Picture our 'bucket boys', like in the picture here, following up with folks they know by name, giving a fist bump and asking how they're doing. Any of us in the church can do this stuff, even in our workplace. What are our priorities? Are there things we can give up in order to make time to get to know someone who needs discipleship? Actually we all need discipleship. It can be just doing life together with folks. One of our guys likes to go bike riding on trails. Does anyone in Lynden enjoy that and could show him around? It's little things like that which make all the difference. Relationship with Jesus and each other is the key and as a church we've got to find ways to make time for it. Life is too short to pass that up. This is just another reminder for all of us as we seek to strengthen the church in its mission of discipleship in Jesus. Pray about how God would be calling you to this as well. Maybe it's just visiting someone at the health care center, maybe something else. But God is calling all of us to the work.

And we are still in serious conversation on a women's Summit house with local churches. **Pray this can come to pass this even this year**.
