One of the things our guys at the Summit house do is called self-evaluation. We ask questions like "what did you do?" "How did it affect those around you?" "Why did you do it?" "What's your game-plan for doing it differently next time?" We always hope to get to the heart of a matter this way and then to bring the Gospel to bear on the situation. We pray with folks and encourage them to pray and ask God for insight. This is something all of us can learn from.

Are you willing to self-evaluate? It's not just a behavior change, but a heart check that can lead to transformation. This is something the church can learn to do with one another and be strengthened by as well. It's amazing how often it seems like one of the guys might not make it another week, but after self-evaluating and praying they get back on track. A similar question we sometimes ask is "what do you need to repent of lately?" These are good question for us all to consider.

On a street night our folks spent a good amount of time at Base Camp talking to folks there. One of those folks was the gal pictured left who was pretty inviting to talk to. She was trying to figure out how much the bus fare was out of Whatcom County. She felt stuck and wanted to leave the area, and described her plight as not having a lot of options. She felt she could either live way out in remote Maple Falls or potentially be mistreated on the streets. Her other option was Base Camp which she felt was too public a place for her. It reminded the team of the particular struggles that a woman can go through being homeless. Women without housing often share with us their fear of being messed with if they are alone. Before the team left they asked if she wanted prayer. She didn't want prayer out loud, but she did feel she can talk to God on her own. As we consider doing Summit houses for women in the future **pray that** God will prepare the hearts of these ladies. The gals that graduate from the Agape Home will be ready and willing to move forward, but they still need our prayer for that path to become clear.

When the team walked down Commercial St. they saw this large conglomeration of stuff,

including a ladder. They thought a business was renovating for a minute. Then they talked to the guy who was camping with it and realized the ladder was his. They asked how long he was staying in that spot. He said just for the night anyway. The crew was surprised about how he could transport all those objects each day. Some folks seem to have nothing; others seem to carry everything they can along with them. But pray they can all come to know Jesus!
