Our 2004 street night crew helped her come out of an abusive relationship and she came to Christ and was baptized. She got clean and sober and then frequented our coffeehouse often, but returned to paganism later on. We just talked on the phone and she, knowing we'd prayed for her, wanted to let us know that she is returning to the Lord. Pray that she grows again in him and bears 30, 60 or even 100 times more fruit in Christ.

Our staff has an upcoming retreat and our theme is "**Strengthening the Church**". Pray that the retreat will be a blessing to us and ultimately a blessing for the churches we are in partnership with. One of our foremost desires is to help the church to make disciples that will make disciples. We hope to do more training sessions in various churches to that end, so be on the lookout for these as we will be announcing them over the next year.

He's looking for something around \$500-950/month. He has a lead for the next six months, but after that he will be in need of a place to rent again.

Our first Christmas concert will be at Second Christian Reformed Church in Lynden on December 2 at 7pm. We hope that this collection of Christmas carols will bless our supporters to meditate on Christ's incarnation, even as we seek to incarnate Christ into the lives of those we work with.

These signs outside Base Camp remind us that God is watching over us while we're out there and especially that he is looking out for those that wander and remain without housing. We lost one of our dear friends to a heroin overdose recently who had even spent some time at our Summit house. **Pray that God will rescue folks out of these perils and into His glorious Kingdom by the power of the Holy Spirit, and even that these folks will come to homestead in the Church instead of in the devil's clutches.** On our most recent street night we noticed more folks have been attacked randomly who live

on the streets, stolen from and harassed. One young man who we prayer for a while back outside of 1st Baptist always seemed drunk and loud and would go on and on. He always wanted us to pray for him for housing and job, and we wondered if he would be able to move forward and see those prayers answered. Then on the last two street nights we met him and learned that not only is he in housing, sober and working, but his job is now to be a security guard for downtown Bellingham. So a man who was once disruptive to downtown is now being used by the LORD to bless the safety of downtown. Only our God can do that! Praise Him with us as we finish this year expectant of what God's Spirit can do.
