The Bellingham Technical College outreach, BTC SALT Fellowship, is launching out on its own this month, just like Envision did out of Hope in Christ Church 20 years ago. BTC SALT will be launched by Envision Mission and registered this year with the state of Washington. Isn't it cool how things come around? **Pray they might reach students there for Christ in a big way!** We're so thankful for that ministry and Mitchell and Claudia will still work as board members for them.

It's important to look at our goals from the past year and evaluate how we did as a ministry: Last year's goals were...

- 1- To start a women's Summit House in Whatcom County- accomplished!
- 2- To do an outreach at Bellingham Technical College or have BTC students join us for an outreach event on the streets (or both) both of those things happened as folks from BTC SALT joined us on more than one occasion for street outreach. And the focus of the ministry became outreach at the school café four days a week!
- 3- To strengthen the Body through **preaching, discipleship partner classes and another CD of Scripture songs** from the Senti's and a corresponding concert of music-Mitchell was able to preach and lead discipleship partner classes frequently with the help of Miles Davis and the Bridges of Hope team on a couple occasions. The Christmas CD and concert was a great success!

For this next year you'll notice in the left margin a proposed change to the mission statement. We replaced the focus on downtown culture with a **new focus entirely on Summit houses.**That is the vision for not only next year but the foreseeable future. Pray for us in this endeavor. Even our street nights, prayer meeting and Jesus Study will now be part of that focus as well. On Street night we have already started doing game nights at the Agape Home and Pursuit program in order to get to know folks there. Our Jesus Studies we hope to have led by Summit house graduates as well as their involvement in street nights. Our prayer time will also keep its focus on Summit house guests and staff.

Our theme for 2023 will be **Truth.** We will share more on that later. Just remember: Jesus is the Truth, and to walk in truth is to walk in His light always. That has to do with being honest in community as we fellowship together and pray for each other. We also hope to share more stories in later newsletters about the lives of our guests with their permission.

We're still looking for an affordable place for one of our friends to move in to towards the beginning of next year. Let us know if you hear of anything. We also would love to help our first lady applicant to get a vehicle as most of her appointments will be in Bellingham. Let us know if you hear of anything, even if at a discount price.
