Stumbling through life with no light on my path. Unable to see clearly what's next. **Now I have God's light, even if I stumble or fall.** God's light helps me see through the low and tough times. I was less of a man without God. I praise Him every day!"

Instead of smoking pot and going nowhere he found himself at the Lighthouse Mission some years ago and upon graduation admitted to having a lot of fear about what was next. He heard about the Summit house through our Belonging Class and decided to apply. We accepted him gladly and all his fears slowly vanished as he adjusted to being the second chef at the Lighthouse Mission, living at the Summit house, going to church at Spring Church in Bellingham and meeting new spiritual friends as a result. He is truly a blessing to all of us and we ask you just to pray that he can persevere as he has been doing for years now by the grace of God.

We've so enjoyed our discipleship class at the Bethel house and Safe People has gone well at the Hope in Christ house also. We could use some more solid candidates for our Second and Bethel Church houses so **please pray for God's blessing and peace on those houses** so He will bring those He wills to bring there. There are only two ladies at the Bethel house and three at the Second Church house currently.
