Update on Envision

One of our friends from the Bethel house got a full time job! We're so proud of her after so many disappointments in searching. God has provided something that will help her give back to those who are going through struggles she used to have herself. Her roommate has also been working in the raspberries thanks to one of our discipleship partners from Second Church in Lynden. She also got to go to a fun weekend with one of her clean and sober programs she's involved in. We specifically prayed for her to learn how to have fun in sobriety and God answered!

The stories of transformation don't always go in the direction we hope or even expect that they will. Sometimes our definition of success has to look and feel different, but God is always at work. Sometimes, honestly, there can be tragedy involved too and that is always hard to deal with. But we'd like to spend the next few months sharing stories that haven't turned out like we expected and yet we want to share how we see God at work nonetheless in smaller ways: One of our friends came through an entire year at the Summit house and at the end of his stay he found it very difficult to be alone without drinking. He always struggled to feel secure, and so would often exaggerate or even tell lies if it helped him look better in other people's eyes. That sense of self worth and shame can often manifest in hiding things from those that our friends love the most, even us who work with them. And such friends are masters at manipulation because it is how they survived life for decades, usually since childhood. Thus after many attempts to go to 'Detox' and treatment we recommended he go back to the Lighthouse Mission where he would face these childhood struggles head on. But it got too difficult to face, so he chose to go back to the streets without addressing those struggles. Again, we attempted to help him do 'Detox', but he refused treatment. Then he found himself hitting bottom after going to the hospital with an overdose. It was after that, he finally chose to come back to his church for help since they had reached out to him so faithfully and lovingly. Some even took him into their homes. But when he asked about the Summit house we still encouraged him to explore his deeper issues first. He then agreed to go to a program not far away that also does a rehabilitation process similar to the Lighthouse Mission. We are so excited that he has humbled himself and been willing to face those things again. Please pray that he finds healing and will be ready either to return to us or a similar program so that he can move forward in all the ways God has enabled him to hope for.
