Let us share another Summit house story:

He came from gang life in Florida, from time in prison and a life lived in fear. He got about as far away as he could, making it to Bellingham, Washington. After entering the Ascent program at the Lighthouse Mission he then entered their internship program when Aaron Speyer was there. After some beautiful spiritual growth he entered a Summit house. During his stay there he grew more in Christ, attending church and studies regularly; working two jobs and meeting with us at Envision. But due to a miscommunication with a fellow guest at the house, he chose to act out with physical force. At that point we had to exit him from the house, even though in so many ways he was thriving. We worried this would hijack his spiritual journey, since that sometimes happens. But he understood our decision, even taking responsibility for his actions immediately, turned himself in, and kept his jobs going strong. He found housing with a clean and sober friend. He stayed in touch with us, kept in step with his support system. Even though he began to falter just a little bit, he caught himself doing it, met with us and asked if he could return to a Summit house at a different location. His housing lease was coming to an end and needed further support. When he received news that his mother was in crisis he praved and wept before God. The LORD showed Himself to our dear friend. and he believed God was instructing him to go back to the south and care for his aging mother. We supported his decision, gave him temporary housing at the Summit house, and prayed with him often about his next steps. He had begun volunteering recently at the Summit thrift store and asked us to commission him in prayer for his next step, that God might go before him. Right there in the thrift store we laid hands on him and prayed. Soon afterward he drove back to his home state, has stayed connected to his family, to church and stays in touch with us. Again, his story was not what we had expected, but God's hand has been with him. We just want to share that even though these stories don't always go in a direction that we can foresee, at least at first glance, God still works out so many details in a way that glorifies Him and is for the good of those who love Him. HalleluYah! Please pray that our friend will continue to grow in Christ Jesus where he is and be a blessing to his family and his church there.
