Summertime, as I've reflected upon before, offers both relief and restlessness. Whereas the fall months offer both routine and responsibility. Now with both come stressors, but by the time Fall rolls around it seems that most folks are ready for re-entry into more organized structure, practical routine and connection.

I've observed this with our guests as well. I find it encouraging to see their desire for continued teachable, meaningful and connective experiences, specifically ones that lead to growth and change, and by the grace of God, literal transformation. Our folks are uniquely hardwired to want to be helpful, useful and effective in serving others, in some ways, seeking to make up for lost time that was given to self-

serving addictive/ compulsive behaviors for years.

Some of the most difficult footsteps Jesus left us to walk in are those involving transparency. Relapses occur in isolation, and while they may be a very visible example of what can happen when we fail to shed the light on



our sin struggle, we all have corners in the recesses of our hearts that we would rather not show others. That's the challenge of accountability. But it comes with an extraordinary promise! As James the brother of Jesus wrote, "Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed." Ja. 5:16 ESV We aren't told to self-flagellate or to expect due scorn, quite the opposite. Once it's out in the open, the damage our sin has caused us can, and will, heal.
