From Miles' Desk: (Program Administrator)

The Meyers-Briggs Type Indicator (MBTI) is a personality test first formulated and widely used in the 1940's and has remained popular in many professional fields. In it, a person answers a series of questions designed to narrow down a person's personality to one of sixteen unique personality types denoted by a four-letter combination: 'E' for Extravert, 'I' for Introvert, 'F' for Feeler, 'J' for Judger, 'N' for Intuitive, 'P' for Perceiver, 'S' for Sensor, and 'T' for Thinker. Perhaps what makes them so successful is the uncanny accuracy with which they describe our characteristics—if only superficially.

I took the Myers-Briggs test years ago, right around the time I'd discovered I was an Otter-Lion at an after-service seminar at church. I got the acronym INFJ and was particularly pleased to learn that it is the rarest personality type there is, with just 1-3% of people scoring that designation. So, I was delighted to hear from one of the men interviewing for Summit House recently when he shared that he, too, belonged to the elite INFJ club.

About a week later, we were interviewing another brother. This man was very different than my fellow INFJ-er. Where the former had the letters for an introverted feeler, the second brother was far more spontaneous and outspoken. What stood out to me after both interviews was not their differences, however.

Each man, regardless of personality, carried a sincere desire to grow in Christ. To contribute, belong, and move forward. Whether an INFJ, ESTP, or something entirely unlettered, what matters to God is the heart posture. There are any number of tests we can take to label everything from our intelligence and aptitudes, but **only Our Lord knows the condition of our heart. And only He is capable of changing it.**
