Street night continues to be a great blessing to those who volunteer and those who we minister to. At the end of one of our nights together, just as we began singing, a young Lummi man approached us, asking if we were a church group. We answered that we came from different churches. He told us that he had recently been shot three times (his gunshot wounds were visible.) He had given his life to God as a result of this near death experience. However, just before he had been shot his father had horrifically abused him. He asked us what to do with his pain and confusion, and we expressed the Gospel to him as well as an encouragement to work towards forgiveness, but keep safe boundaries with his dad. He also asked where he could go. We told him about the Lighthouse Mission and gave him information on who to call and where to go. He was so thankful, and what a joy to pray for him and encourage him. **Please keep this man in prayer for healing and restoration in Christ Jesus.**



Another story: **Reid McEvoy** recently received a certificate for completing one year in the Summit house, along with two other men. He has been a friend and volunteer with Envision for eight years, first joining us for prayer on Fridays and then helping with street night long before he came to live in one of our Summit Houses. In the past, he had participated in other discipleship programs, but found himself in need of such support again, as certain addictions seemed to still take hold. Reid has been living in the Summit House for over a year now, working through the Genesis Process with us and making progress in terms of understanding the heart and the deeper roots behind his struggle. He is working as a caregiver at a local assisted living facility. **Please pray that he can have complete victory and come into that which God has prepared in advance for him to do in Christ Jesus!**
