

Mitchell gave them a tour of downtown and they interacted with folks on the streets as well. At the end of the night they prayed with a Sunday night youth team of 50-60 students who give out hamburgers on the streets on Sunday nights. What a joy to hear the stories and have this time together. Our street night continues to be blessed on Tuesday nights also. There's another group that goes out on Thursdays, so the prayer that God would raise up workers for the harvest has been answered by the Lord with a resounding "yes!" **Pray that these groups continue to be faithful with the Gospel in word and deed.**

Aman came to us from Kyrgystan, having been through military combat overseas. On more than one occasion he could have died in battle, but God saved his life. He wondered why. His family had a Christian background, but he gave his life to Christ personally and was baptized. Then he came to America on asylum. He came to us looking for Christian community. At first



his memory wasn't that great from trauma, but overtime he has settled in, found a church, local work with a company owned by Christians and eventually the LORD has led us to make him the resident assistant at the Second Church Summit House. He is dealy loved and **please pray that God will continue to guide him in his path as he is here, seeking the LORD.**
